A Short History of the Friends of Wortham Church

Twenty years ago, after a rather depressing report on the state of the church fabric, Geraldine Rash suggested that The Friends of Wortham Church should be created. This would take over the fund raising needed for future church repairs from the PCC. In 1996 the Friends were formed with 26 members under the chairmanship of Edward Coales. Subscriptions rose quickly to 40 and the Friends soon had £6,000 in the bank. The next year, with the help of grants, essential repairs to the church were carried out and after twenty years £300,000 has been spent on repairs and improvements. The Friends have raised £140,000 towards this total. By 2016 the number of subscriptions has risen to over 100 and the fact that so many people in the parish have become members has given a renewed interest in the church.

Over the years many fund raising events have been organised by the Friends, usually five or six a year, all of which have been well supported by the village. The most notable event was in 2002 when the musical 'Cobbold's Tales', written by Sue Heaser, was held in the church and raised nearly £5,000. The Victorian market was first held in December 2009 and ran for six years. Improvements to the church that have been funded by the Friends have included a kitchen area and WC, a car park, radiant heaters and a PA system. A beautiful addition has been the new stained glass window in the north aisle to commemorate the centenary of the diocese. For the last 15 years the Chairman of the Friends has been Maureen Ling and she deserves special thanks for giving so much of her time and for making the Friends such a success.
