### **Remembrance Sunday**

Prayers were said at the War Memorial where three wreaths were laid: for Wortham & Burgate Parish Council by Stephen Rash, for Wortham Primary School by pupils Julian and Heather Parsell and by David Appleton. Everyone then moved into St Mary's for the Remembrance Service which was led by Reader Graham Reardon with organist Myra Pinnell. The Roll of Honour of the men who lost their lives in the parish was read by Janet Bromley and the Silent Tribute was given by Sheila Rush. The two readings were given by Cathy Hume and Sheila Rush and the intercessions were read by Lyn Pelham Burn. The collection was taken by Cathy Hume and John Scott for the work of the Royal British Legion and after the service coffee was served at the back of the church.

Hazel and Colin's golden wedding anniversary was on October 17th and Hazel died a few days later with Colin and Deb by her bedside. However this was not before she had received the news that granddaughter Hannah was safely on the plane on a school trip to Iceland. Hazel was well known in the village and will be sadly missed by so many people but especially by her beloved family. So goodbye Hazel, rest in peace, until we all meet again in God's care.
