Douglas Leonard Cole (Doug) April 8th 1923 - April 11th 2015

A service of Thanksgiving for the life of Douglas Leonard Cole was held at St Mary's Church Wortham on Tuesday 28th April and a large congregation was present. A lovely caring service was given by Reverend Ginny Manning with organist Nigel Ballard. The opening music was 'Going Home' by Dvorák. A very moving eulogy was given by daughter Andrea and a poem was read by Stephen. Doug was with the 8th Army and found himself working to unravel one of the most potent weapons of the Axis powers, the Enigma Code. He was secretly intercepting transmissions to Bletchley Park for analysis and even after the war those who had worked at Bletchley Park were not able to talk about their work for 50 years. He retired to Wortham with his wife Maureen and became involved with the Suffolk County Bowls Association , Wortham Bowls Club, Wortham Wine Club and the Probus Club. We send our condolences to his family. Rest in peace Doug until we all meet again in God's care.
